

# A letter from Brian C. Klafehn, President of CP Rochester



### **Doorways**

The cover of this issue of the Voice tells just a part of one story about how CP Rochester continues "Opening Doors...Changing Lives". Aaron Wallace, pictured with his sister Shayla, has encountered many physical barriers throughout his life. When he was younger, his family was concerned about him being cared for and living at home. They worried about how to include him in family activities. CP Rochester stepped in to support this young man and his family by providing access to multiple services including home renovations. As he has gotten older, physical barriers in the community have become even more difficult to negotiate. But perhaps none was more real and troublesome

than simply getting up to, and in and out of, the front door of the family's home. As you can see, there is now a curving incline in front of the house that allows him to easily get in and out of his house using his wheelchair. This ramp and many other projects including building a downstairs bathroom, were completed by CP Rochester through one of the government funded renovation programs that we have operated for several years now. These programs allow us to complete renovations to people's homes, enabling them to live more independently when they have a physical challenge and their home no longer "fits" them. These Accessible Home Renovations are a literal example of how we are working each day to remove barriers to inclusion and independence for people with physical challenges.

For someone with a physical challenge who wants to be part of a ski group, getting to the slope is only the first obstacle to overcome. Getting up and down the slope is another physical barrier to participating. Shared Ski Adventure volunteers like Zach, whose story you can read inside this issue, have joyfully helped people with physical challenges to overcome those barriers. Adaptive ski equipment and some guidance allow a person with a disability to experience the thrill and excitement of downhill skiing. Even when physical barriers are overcome, however, there are still obstacles to being fully included. Opening our hearts and minds and sharing our common interests and passions like skiing, running or volunteering is the way in which we begin figuratively "Opening doors..." Zach and all of the people who are part of our CP Rochester family understand this is how we really go about changing lives. We ask that you join all of us in making a friend, changing a life and removing the dis from disabilities<sup>®</sup>.

## Day Of Caring

Thursday May 13th saw an army of volunteers at CP Rochester's

Winton Road Campus. There were 50 GE MDS/Xerox employees who were spending their day doing good deeds. After the long winter there were weeds to pull, gardens to plant, mulch to spread, lawn repairs to be made and picnic tables to paint. Inside there were children being entertained by a wonderful carnival of activities. The squeals of delight confirmed that fun was being had with dancing. game playing, face-painting, drumming, bowling, crafting and dressing up.

Elsewhere at our Residences many more Day of Caring Volunteers were throwing themselves into all sorts of chores...

At our **Jefferson Road House** the vard was spruced up, the dining room table was refinished and the garage was cleaned and organized by a team of 30 people from Nixon Peabody

The yard at our **Pinnacle Road House** received a huge improvement thanks to the hard work of ten volunteers from Paetec who went on to sand and refinish tables and building a wooden garbage enclosure.

Our Davenport-Hatch Respite Home benefitted from the hard work of 10 Paetec employees who set to sanding and finishing the dining room table, power washing and repairing the deck, staining the swing and clearing up the yard

At the **Benedict Road Residence** a 10 person team from Butler/Till stained and weather-proofed patio furniture and a picnic table. They also built raised gardens, removed debris and stumps and reseeded a portion of the yard.

A 12 person team from the ARC of Monroe helped out our

**Day Program Areas** by weeding and clearing the gardens and organizing the classroom.

The dining room table was sanded and finished and the deck, repaired and restained by 10 Rotork volunteers at our Elmwood Avenue House.

A team from Kodak repaired a kitchen work station at our **Jefferson Road House** and then went on to repair a tree seat and build picnic tables and make a bocce court at our Kings Highway House. Also the yard and vans were cleaned by another nine person Kodak team.

At the Lone Oak Residence the yard was cleared up, the deck and a bench was stained and garage and closet shelves built by a seven person team from Caldwell Manufacturing.

At the Misty Pines Residence the yard was thoroughly cleared out by the Fairport Webster ELKS Lodge who also managed to do some spring cleaning. Then a seven person Kodak team took care of some tree work. In all 850 man hours were logged by these Day of Caring Volunteers. That's a lot of caring—for which we are profoundly grateful.



## ABVI Goodwill and CP Rochester Collaborate

CP Rochester became a drop-off point for a Goodwill Donation Drive from Monday, December 21st to Thursday, December 31st last year. This was a "trial run" of sorts for us as we discussed the possibilities of a mutually beneficial collaboration between CP Rochester and ABVI Goodwill. A substantial number of items were dropped off and our Adult Day Program participants were kept busy, helping to sort items and distributing receipts to the donors.

ABVI Goodwill raises funds to support its many programs and services for the blind and visually impaired through income from their Goodwill stores. There are eight Goodwill stores in the Rochester area and that number continues to grow. Their success is heavily

dependant on support from the local community in collecting donations of gently-used

clothing, footwear, linens, drapery and other household items.

Goodwill's ability to thrive also relies upon employing individuals to sort, price, display and sell items in their stores and CP Rochester has willing hands to assist in this process. So our collaboration is official. In June a Goodwill Donation Station will be set up just inside our Winton Road Campus, Castle Road entrance and our Day Program participants will receive training in the retail trade. Altogether a mutually beneficial enterprise.

## Run for Fun 2010

Mathematics. He works part time as a room server at The Woodcliff Hotel and Spa and enjoys playing basketball and football, camping and playing the piano. Last September he ran a Half Marathon with his father. Even with his full and active life and hectic schedule. Zack wouldn't dream of giving up his Winter Saturdays at Swain. There he has seen first hand what it is to be courageous and overcome barriers. His dedication has earned him the respect and admiration of the participants and volunteers at Shared Ski Adventures who are delighted to learn that he plans to continue to dedicate his winter Saturdays by giving back to this unique program.

## **Board Member Highlight**



Jeffrey W. Baker was raised in Penfield, New York, graduating from Penfield High School in 1963. He then attended the State University of New York at Buffalo until 1967, earning a BS degree in Business Administration. Jeff went on to obtain his Juris Doctor degree in 1970 through his studies at Union University, Albany Law School. From 1970 until 1974 Jeff served as a lieutenant in the United States Coast Guard Judge Advocate General Program. He became a partner in the Harris Beach Law Firm in 1981, which continued until 1999 when he became corporate counsel to REDCOM Laboratories Inc. in Victor, where he is currently practicing.

Jeff and Carol, his wife of 42 years, have lived in Fairport and Victor where they raised a son and a daughter who were encouraged to "give back" to their community. Jeff's father, a disabled World War II veteran, provided Jeff with an appreciation for the challenges faced by those with differing abilities. As a result, it was important to the Bakers that their children meet and interact with children and adults with differing abilities. In the mid-1980s, Jeff and his children volunteered at what was then the Gym and Swim program at CP Rochester.

Jeff's volunteer experience served as a solid beginning to his involvement with CP Rochester. In 1987, he joined the Board of Directors and has served continually except for a one-year break in 1996-97. He has held numerous positions on the Board and served on several Committees. From there his Board work spilled over into assisting Al Sigl and its member agencies in an advisory role.

Now, Jeff's volunteering has come full circle. He visits CP Rochester every Monday to volunteer in the Children's Swim Program. Adaptive Physical Education Teacher, Ben Hawkins, is thrilled to have Jeff volunteering in the program. He calls it, "...a perfect match! He loves the kids and the kids just love him!"
