Zackary "Zack" Mbuyee is a four-year-old boy with a sweet personality and a bright smile that lights up the room. He is very lovable and observant. Zack goes to CP Rochester's Augustin Children's Center. His mother, Stephanie, is very pleased with the support that he is receiving and feels that his entire team, including the Occupational Therapist, Physical Therapist, Speech Pathologist and Music Therapist have been great. Zack has developed a special bond with his teacher, Erin Davis. "They all know Zackary and how to work with him."

He is focusing on increasing his use of language and feeling comfortable in different settings. Zack and Miss Erin recently celebrated a milestone when Zack said Miss Erin's name for the first time! "Thank you, CP Rochester, for doing everything you can to help my son succeed!"



Travis Daren Burkhard was diagnosed with Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy when he was six years old. By the age of 13, he was no longer able to walk and started to use a power chair. Even though he has some limitations, Travis does not let that stop him. With a lot of hard work and support, he has learned to do things that other people can do but in a different way.

Travis was referred to CP Rochester's Clinic at a young age. He has received Physical Therapy and Occupational Therapy through the outpatient clinic for almost 15 years. Travis recently participated in Rochester Rehabilitation's DriveOn program. Travis graduated from Gates Chili High School, and is enrolled at Monroe Community College (MCC) where he is studying Computer Systems Technology. Because of his determination and hard work, Travis will be a success regardless of what path he chooses!



Born with Cerebral Palsy, **Jane Gefell** has received services from CP Rochester for 57 years. She attends the Day Habilitation program, lives at a residential site, and works with the therapists through our outpatient clinic. Jane is a published author, teacher, volunteer and an all-around good person.


To Jane, the most important things are her faith and her family. She keeps in touch with extended family, some from faraway places by using social media. Having published three books, Jane writes in-depth about what life is like living with a disability, her love for family, and her deep-rooted faith. Through sharing inspirational stories, Jane evokes the message that there is happiness and purpose to everyone's life, regardless of their challenges.



Parker Vorozilchak is an amazing five-year-old boy who has utilized services at Happiness House in Geneva for the past three years. The oldest son of Drs. Michael and Meredith Vorozilchak, Parker was born six weeks early and has required numerous surgeries and multiple lengthy hospital stays throughout his young life. He has a rare condition that affects the growth and development of the bones and structures in his head and face.

To help with growth and development, Parker has received Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, and Speech Therapy Services at Happiness House. He attended preschool in one of their integrated classrooms.

Parker has made tremendous gains and improvements each year thanks to the amazing providers and teachers he's worked with and continues to make great progress.



Michelle Steele has had her ups and downs in life but she has worked hard to get to where she is today and she credits a lot of her success to her time at Rochester Rehabilitation's Ventures PROS Program.

At times, Michelle's life became very rough. Fighting addiction, Michelle was introduced to Rochester Rehabilitation, when her counselor suggested that she enroll in Ventures PROS. The people at Rochester Rehabilitation became Michelle's biggest supporters. They helped her to understand her struggles and how to "let go of things that did not matter". They taught her how to be mindful of what she was doing and to focus on the "now". The time she spent at Ventures PROS helped Michelle deal with her depression and control her anger.

Rochester Rehabilitation provided Michelle with opportunities that allowed her to get back into the workforce and helped her become independent again. She began volunteering at the Rochester Museum and Science Center (RMSC) and was soon hired on as staff. Michelle attended a few semesters at Monroe Community College (MCC) to gain skills in office/medical file clerk support and hopes to return to Rochester Educational Opportunity Center (REOC) to complete that path.

With over eight years of sobriety and a stronger sense of self, Michelle has started to work on her creative side. She is now making hats and has hopes of starting a small business to sell them. Michelle is confident that she will continue on this path of success toward a bright future, one that she attributes to her time with Rochester Rehabilitation and the staff that supported her through her toughest times.











UPDATE ON THE GOLISANO AUTISM CENTER

Two essential resources are available TODAY: Autism Family Navigator and Autism HelpLine! The Golisano Autism Center, the only one of its kind in our region, is expected to open in the Fall of 2019. The Center will serve as a central resource for all individuals and their families, providing access to multiple autism-related services throughout their lifetime, under the same roof - the Golisano Autism Center roof - in the City of Rochester.

In response to recent tragic events, the Golisano Autism Center founding partners AutismUp, Al Sigl Community of Agencies, CP Rochester and the Golisano Foundation recognized families had a vital and immediate need – to be connected to the programs and services our community offers before the Center opens. To address this need, the lead partners put in place two initiatives that families have begun to access and rely on; the Autism Family Navigator and the Autism HelpLine.

Melissa Parrish has assumed the new position of the Golisano Autism Center Family Navigator whose role is to assist families in urban areas with learning about access to the wide variety of autism services available. Ms. Parrish is a human services professional and adult educator with over 20 years of experience in recruitment, program and case management, youth development, college and career counseling, volunteer coordination, advocacy education, training design and facilitation, and community education. The navigator's office is located at the Boys & Girls Club in the City of Rochester. The Family Navigator will also be available to families at information and resource events within the Greater Rochester community throughout the year. The Golisano Autism Center Family Navigator can be reached by email at mparrish@ autismup.org or by calling (585) 248-9011, ext. 115.

The Autism HelpLine, (866) AUTISM-4, is a dedicated, 18-hour-a-day phone line staffed by 211 operators from 6 AM – 12 AM EST, seven days a week. This information and referral service is for callers in the Greater Rochester and surrounding areas with questions about autism. Messages can be left after hours by emailing HelpLine@GolisanoAutismCenter.org. These two essential resources are available TODAY!

The Golisano Autism Center is a collaborative community of providers that will help revolutionize service delivery for individuals with autism, and their families, in the Greater Rochester and surrounding areas. To achieve this, the Center will provide a comprehensive, enriched and innovative model that co-locates and coordinates resources offered by multiple providers who are experts in ASD knowledge, and in their specific services areas.



Lucas Sheasley is a loving, bubbly, sweet, six-year-old boy. Like most children his age, he loves to talk to people, but it wasn't always that way. Because of some delays, Lucas' parents, Daria and Chris Sheasley started looking for a preschool for their son when he was three years old. Augustin Children's Center at CP Rochester proved to be the right setting for their son. "CP Rochester was amazing from the very beginning for Lucas."

When he first started at preschool, Lucas was nonverbal and he didn't interact with other children. His teacher, Erin Davis, and her staff changed all that.

"They opened up possibilities for my son and really helped him develop the social skills he needed to move forward. I can't overstate the role they played in his life and I will forever be grateful to Erin and the other teachers that worked with him. Without CP Rochester, I don't think Lucas would be where he is today." In the two years that Lucas attended preschool at CP Rochester, he showed incredible improvement. In addition to his two years in Miss Erin's class, Lucas also received services in Speech Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy and Music Therapy.



Understanding Where Your Gift Goes

Ability Partners Foundation supports the missions of CP Rochester, Happiness House, and Rochester Rehabilitation, so it is important to understand where monetary and in-kind gifts go once they are given by a donor.


Nearly every gift given to CP Rochester, Happiness House, Rochester Rehabilitation, and Ability Partners Foundation benefits ALL organizations! Monies raised from the two Galas, the Autism Awareness Walk, 5K Run for Fun and 1 Mile Walk for Wellness, Francis 'Ben' Bonafiglia Golf Tournament, Bowling to Raise Bucks, and most other events are accepted by Ability Partners Foundation. This means, by participating in any agency event, your contribution helps all three agencies! Now, donors' gifts carry a much greater impact. In addition, general gifts to CP Rochester, Happiness House, and Rochester Rehabilitation throughout the year benefit all agencies.

There are certainly exceptions to the rule. Gifts that are made to a specific program or service at an agency are reserved solely for that agency. For example, if a donor wishes to give \$1,000 to the Happiness House Structured Day Program, Ability Partners Foundation will process the gift and only apply it to that specific program at Happiness House. Where this is typically most prevalent is with in-kind gifts (furniture, food, etc.) but it can happen with monetary gifts as well. In order for this type of donor designated gift to occur, the donor must submit the request in writing when making the gift.

When writing a check to benefit CP Rochester, Happiness House, or Rochester Rehabilitation, we ask that you make it out to Ability Partners Foundation. However, even if your check is made out to one of the agencies, it will still benefit all three (unless you designate your gift to a specific program or agency).

Thank you for your generosity over the years! Rest assured, CP Rochester, Happiness House, and Rochester Rehabilitation apply good stewardship to any and all gifts given to our agencies. If you would like to make a donation now, you can do so using the enclosed envelope, or visit us on-line.

NYS ELKS ASSOCIATION GRANT AWARDS

We are pleased to announce that CP Rochester and Happiness House are each recipients of 2018 Major Projects Grant Awards.

CP Rochester has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$2,000 which will support students enrolled in the 2018-2019 Bridges to Earning, Living and Learning (BELL) program. BELL students attend classes at Roberts Wesleyan College and receive support from CP Rochester staff in developing the skills necessary for success in pursuit of their two-year college certificate.

Happiness House received a grant in the amount of \$1,050 to purchase musical instruments for Day Habilitation. The implementation of a music program will provide increased opportunities for movement (use of small musical instruments) dance, increase vocalization (through song), intellectual stimulation and social engagement.

We extend to NYS ELKS Association our sincere appreciation for their generosity and for all they do in support of the individuals served by CP of NYS affiliate organizations such as CP Rochester and Happiness House.

ROCHESTER PRESS-RADIO CLUB GRANT AWARD

The Rochester Press-Radio Club has been a generous supporter of children's charities since 1949. This fall, SportsNet was awarded a grant in the amount of \$1,050 which will be used to purchase three Sport Hybrid Bicycles. The addition of this equipment will enable SportsNet to increase the number of individuals who can participate in this very popular community based cycling program. Since 2014 the Rochester Press-Radio Club has awarded SportsNet a total of \$3,050 in grant funds for various children's recreation initiatives. We are grateful for their support on behalf of children in need throughout our community.

WEGMANS FOOD MARKETS, INC. GRANT AWARD

CP Rochester is in contact with 20 young adults wishing to move from their family home/IRA to non-certified Transition Apartments that will provide skill development opportunities needed to subsequently transition to community based independent living in two to three years' time. In 2019, CP Rochester will renovate 77 Pinnacle Road to provide seven Transition Apartments for individuals with developmental disabilities.

Each apartment will consist of kitchen, dining/living, bedroom and bathroom areas. In this way each individual has an apartment to maintain and plan for: shopping for food, cleaning supplies and household items; planning and preparing meals; completing household chores; etc., thereby developing and practicing the skills needed to safely and successfully transition to independent community housing.

In support of this initiative Wegmans Food Markets, Inc. has provided a generous grant of \$30,000 to CP Rochester. These funds will be used toward the purchase of appliances, window coverings or housewares needed to set up each individual apartment. Wegmans Food Markets, Inc. has also offered to fill all the kitchen cabinets with food supplies to get the new residents off to a good start. Wegmans Food Markets, Inc. has been a generous supporter of CP Rochester, Happiness House and Rochester Rehabilitation. We thank them for their continued support and for making such an impactful difference in the lives of the young people we will serve in the Transition Apartments, now and in the years to come.
